Dear Parents and Carers,

Phillipians 4:4-7 tells us,

Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! ⁵Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. ⁶Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. ⁷And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

However, in our modern times we are experiencing a wave of anxiety affecting our children. One in four primary children in Tasmania has diagnosable levels of anxiety! That is 25%!

As children move into young adulthood this anxiety changes the prospect of joyous teenage years, wreaks increasing levels of havoc on wellbeing as students collide with the challenges of expectations and pressure in Year 11 and 12 subjects. The collection of parents who comprise the School Council have been discussing how best to intervene and support parents and students in dealing with this challenging issue. I am thankful for the commitment of these people to the welfare of our community.

I am delighted to announce that celebrated psychologist Andrew Fuller will be visiting Calvin to conduct a series of workshops with parents, teachers, and students on Monday I7th and Tuesday I8th September. The purpose of these workshops is to inform and give practical strategies on managing this within family and community.

Andrew will be delivering a parent seminar on the evening of Monday 17th September. Further details will be coming to parents soon, but I would urge that all parents claim this date in their diary. The venue will be the Multi-Purpose Hall at Calvin Primary School.

From the Principal continued



Andrew has recently been described as an "interesting mixture of Billy Connolly, Tim Winton and Frasier Crane" and as someone who "puts the heart back into psychology". As a clinical psychologist, Andrew Fuller works with many schools and communities in Australia and internationally, specialising in the wellbeing of young people and their families. He is a Fellow of the Department of Psychiatry and the Department of Learning and

Educational Development at the University of Melbourne.

Andrew has been a principal consultant to the National Drug Prevention Strategy REDI, the ABC on children's television shows, is an Ambassador for Mind Matters and is a member of the National Coalition Against Bullying.

The concept of "resilience" offers a coherent framework for the creation of schools that are sensitive to the developmental needs of young people and their teachers. As Andrew describes, resilience is "the happy knack of being able to bungy jump through the pitfalls of life – to rise above adversity and obstacles."

He is the author of TRICKY KIDS, GUERILLA TACTICS FOR TEACHERS, HELP YOUR CHILD SUCCEED AT SCHOOL, (RAISING REAL PEOPLE (ACER), FROM SURVIVING TO THRIVING (ACER), WORK SMARTER NOT HARDER and BEATING BULLIES. Andrew has also co-authored a series of programs for the promotion of resilience and emotional intelligence used in over 3500 schools in Britain and Australia called THE HEART MASTERS.

Andrew has established programs for the promotion of mental health in schools, substance abuse prevention, and the reduction of violence and bullying, suicide prevention programs and for assisting homeless young people. Andrew continues



TEAR Read-a-thon

For a period of four weeks from Monday 13th August through to Monday 10th September students in Prep to Year 6 will be participating in the TEAR Read-athon.

This is the first year TEAR Australia are running a Read-a-thon and they have asked us at Calvin Christian School to support them by being part of it. TEAR Australia is a movement of Christians in Australia who respond to the needs of poor communities around the world. Their motivation comes from the belief that God loves all people, and in Christ offers them the opportunity of a new life. They believe that God is just, and has particular care for the poor and those who suffer as victims of injustice.

"Defend the cause of the weak and fatherless; maintain the rights of the poor and oppressed. Rescue the weak and needy."

The specific focus of the TEAR Read-a-thon is to raise money to help people in poverty around the world get access to an education.

\$5 – Can help provide pre-school classes that prepare children for government primary schools. Without these classes, children in countries like Ethiopia are not able to enrol in primary school.

\$10 - Can help train a teacher to make a difference in the lives of their students. In places like South Sudan, many children miss out on an education because the school doesn't have enough teachers.




YEAR 6
