From the Deputy Principal - Primary








We also had a visit from Charlotte's hermit crabs! They stayed with us all day and they were very interesting.

UNITED NATIONS YOUTH VOICE NATIONAL FINALS 2019

Tessa Shea is jetting off to Perth for the United Nations Youth Voice National Finals 2019 – this Sunday!

In 2018 a number of Calvin students participated in the Junior section of the UN Youth Voice public speaking competition. Tessa Shea made it through to the finals that were held at Tasmania's Parliament House in September 2018. From this, Tessa gained a place in the Voice National Finals 2019, which will be running next week, 14th to the 18th of April 2019, in Perth, Western Australia.

Tessa, as a member of the Tasmanian contingent, will be leaving for Perth this Sunday. Apart from the fun of the long flight to Perth, Tessa and the other delegates will participate in a four day itinerary that includes: socialising activities, public speaking related activities such as workshops, speakers panels, meeting and listening to United Nations Youth representatives, Quiz Night, Fremantle Scavenger Hunt, Perth City sightseeing – as well as the Competition's Preliminary Round Speeches and Grand Final!

The UN Voice Finals requires participants to deliver two prepared speeches that propose a solution to a given topic. For example: How can we ensure the adequacy and sustainability of our energy supply in Australia? And: How can the Australian court system better provide justice?

It is a packed few days offering participants incredible opportunities on many levels. Tessa, who is well underway with preparing her speeches, says she is beginning to feel: '...really excited – and a little terrified!'

It is an honour for Calvin to have a representative in this prestigious competition and know that Tessa will give her all to representing herself and the school.

YEAR 7 SCIENCE

Water is essential for life and without it life would cease to exist. But access to pure, clean drinking water is not something that just magically happens. Fortunately in Tasmania we have systems and processes in place to ensure that we are safe from contaminants such as microbes, heavy metals and chemicals from agricultural and industrial sectors.

On Tuesday, the year 7's partook in a tour of the **Bryn Estyn Water Treatment Plant** in worder to observe first hand how water gets from the Derwent River into our households. They learnt about the pumping, filtration, carbon loading and flocculation processes that need to occur to make water crystal clear and safe for us to consume.

Students also had a first hand tour of the salmon ponds, and learnt about the history of trout in Tasmania and the processes that are in place to keep the water ponds habitatal for the fish. Both these sites provided evidence and real life application of the scientific processes that we have been learning about in Science this year.

The opportunity to feed a frenzy of hungry trout also proved quite entertaining, as did the capturing of local bugs and waders in the Plenty River. Overall, a good day was had by all, and students are more aware of the effort and energy that goes into treating their drinking water.


