Dear Parents and Carers,

On the first day of school, all students from Prep to Year 12 attended a chapel service.

The purpose in gathering together was to be one community before God and to affirm that we are a Kindergarten to Year 12 community. Our conviction to place God first in our lives needs to be symbolically represented to have organisational significance. During the service, I called students to consider their approach to life in 2019 as an operating system like in a computer. And I challenged all students to update their operating system (OS).

The metaphor seems straight forward. The operating system controls working memory, allocation of resources, processing, and all manner of other things. Importantly, it runs on a series of assumptions that controls the interactions and output.

My phone and computer are constantly sending me messages to accept the update in order to obtain optimum results. Even as I type this newsletter, my phone is reminding me that updating to iOS version 12.1.4 is required. The new school year is time to update to OS version 2019.1.

The challenge in this is that I must accept the update. Without my agreement the operating system will linger past its use-by date. All manner of bugs will exist and new features will be unable to be imported. A sorry state of affairs indeed. I cannot live today on yesterday's operating system. Our students cannot succeed in the challenges of a new year level with the habits and attitudes of last year.

To support this system update for 2019, a series of activities and events has been organised for this term.

In the **primary school**, we are holding the **Welcome Barbecue** this evening. This is an occasion for students and families to meet their class teachers. Importantly, this is followed by the **Parent Talk night** on **Monday 25th and Tuesday 26th February**. Both events serve as great opportunities to frame goals for the year and discuss the desired developments in approach, character and performance.

In the **secondary school**, students are in the process of reviewing their 2018 end-of-year reports and setting two goals for this year. These goals will form one element of the **Parent Talk evenings** on **Tuesday 5th and Wednesday 6th March**. In these meetings, parents and students meet with Home Room teachers to provide a context, share responses to the 2018 school year, and to set goals and agree on the emphasis for 2019.

Importantly, these nights are vital to establish the common language and focus between home and school. I encourage all parents to consider their expectations for the year prior to attending the Parent Talk evening. Students should attend the evening in the secondary school.

Our goals are surely not limited to the academic realm. Character is critical. This is the focus of 'Be Your Best'. Performance is secured by right application, perseverance, diligence, attitude, etc.

Scripture entreats us, 'Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to discern what is the good, pleasing, and perfect will of God.' (Romans 12:2) I trust that the process that we have established serves your family well.



IMMUNISATIONS YEAR 7

The Kingborough Council will be providing immunisations to Year 7 at Calvin on **Tuesday 5th March at 1.45pm** as part of their School Based Immunisation Program.

The following vaccines will be provided:

- Human papillomavirus (HPV) two doses given six months apart.
- Diphtheria, Tetanus and Pertussis (whooping cough) dTpa one dose.

These forms need to be filled out and returned to school by **Wednesday 20th February.** Please note that these forms need to be fully filled out, regardless of whether your child will be getting immunised or not. There is a section for YES and NO on the back of each form. We require this information to send to the Department of Health and for the Council's own records.
