Dear Parents and Carers,

As we all returned to school from a holiday break this week, I returned from a slightly more extended leave. I enjoyed a peaceful time connecting with friends and family, and have returned refreshed and revitalised. An important element in achieving a restful vacation was knowing that the school was capably led in my absence by Andrew Nash (Acting Principal) and Bonny Moroni (Acting Deputy Principal – Head of the Secondary). I thank them for their excellent leadership and capable administration of the school in my absence.

Our Co-curricular Program serves many purposes. Providing avenues that foster student growth in areas of capability and gifting is one important element. There are seven pillars of the co-curricular program, namely, Service, Arts/Culture, General Interest, Academic Extension, Academic Competitions, Sport and Outdoor Education, and Camps.

As part of this program, our students have achieved significant feats in recent academic competitions.

Two Calvin students have won medals for the highest achievement in Tasmania in the (International Competitions and Assessments for Schools) ICAS Writing Competition. ICAS Assessments are designed to assess students' ability to use classroom and curriculum learning in new contexts, requiring the use of higher-order thinking and problem-solving skills.

Congratulations to Beth Hochman (Year 12) and Tessa Shea (Year 8) for achieving this outstanding level of proficiency.

The Education Perfect World Mathematics Championships were held in July, and Amelia Smith (Year 7) has placed in the top 10% of 60,000 students who competed across the world. Amelia answered 1,379 maths questions. This is a significant ranking and I am sure all will join in expressing our admiration for Amelia's success.

In the National History Challenge, Calvin students achieved exceptional results in the State selection for the National History Challenge. Several students had their work selected as eligible for being awarded one of three State finalist awards. They were, Vincent Mukundu (Year 12), James Tyers and Sam Excell (Year 10), Olivia Bittner and Jaylen Emery (Year 9), and a Grade 5/6 team of Lucas Boks, Jacob Lanting, Sam El-Tahche, and Michael Shim. This is a significant sweep of the recommendations by students from Calvin.


End of Year Assemblies and Events

RECONCILIATION TASMANIA - YOUTH SPEAKOUT

On Wednesday, Tessa Shea (Year 8) and Lucy Memory (Year 7) were invited by Reconciliation Tasmania to present their work on "How can we better achieve reconciliation outcomes in Tasmania?" They were among thirty other students from around the State who were able to make the trip to Hobart for the day. Each gathering place was greeted by a traditional Aboriginal smoking ceremony and a Welcome to Country. As Her Excellency, the Governor, Professor Kate Warner said in her welcoming speech to the students, "Today you have presented your ideas to the political body of this State [at Parliament House], the Civic [at Town Hall] and now the Vice-Regal [Government House]. Your ideas have been heard and appreciated by all levels of Government."

Tessa and Lucy presented their speeches at both Parliament House and the Town Hall. The Premier, Leader of the Opposition and Leader of the Greens all commented on how all of the students had spoken from the heart and that their research and ideas were being listened to. Co-chair of Reconciliation Tasmania, Fiona Hughes, herself a Tasmanian Aborigine, was also impressed by the depth of understanding that the students revealed. This was the Inaugural Youth Speakout and it is planned to be held every two years. Congratulations to Tessa and Lucy for the excellence of their presentations and for the confident and proficient way they spoke at the different venues.
