Easter is the most sacred time in our faith. It is that most important 'moment' when death and resurrection change history. On Good Friday we lament His death and reflect on His sacrifice. On Sunday we marvel at His triumph over Death's sting.

The various stages of Easter also serve to highlight the variety of human responses to our saviour king.

When Jesus needed prayer in Gethsemane, the disciples slept.

On Palm Sunday the Jews of Jesus' time welcomed their King. They were expecting a militaristic leader riding a stallion and they met a man of peace on his donkey.

On Thursday, many of the same crowd 'convicted' Jesus and sent him to the cross.

The Apostle Peter denied Jesus three times despite his conviction in the strength of his faith. Only a few were faithful at every turn.

One common thread is how people's expectations differed from God's plan.

- The Jews expected a warrior, yet welcomed the King of Peace.
- They expected conquest and yet were spectators to the sacrifice on Friday.
- As the faithful consoled themselves with loss, there was surprised re-acquaintance on Sunday.
- Even after the resurrection, and as they huddled faithful yet powerless in the upper room, they could not have expected God's spirit.

At almost every point, the expectations were at variance to God's plan.

Yet strangely, everything that happened was predicted. It was all written in their scriptures. Every feast and celebration in Israel pointed to the scapegoat, the sacrifice, the New Covenant, and the word going to the Gentiles.

What are we expecting this Easter? How do we envision our King?

Do we invest Jesus with our hopes and beliefs? Are our hopes in alignment with His will and plan? Is our view of the world really the same as that of Jesus?

- Would we have decried Saul and sought David?
- Would we have embraced John the Baptist as a member of our cell group dashing out to Salamanca Fresh to acquire fresh locusts for supper to make him welcome?

Jesus told us in John, Chapter 17 that he came to reveal God's heart to us so that we may more fully inherit it.


Why is it so hard to see myself as Jesus does? This is a daily difference wherein I differ from God's plan.


