Dear Parents and Community members,

Feedback is crucial to the learning process. Educational research continually supports that providing accurate and timely feedback assists the learner in knowing where they are, and allows the teacher to rightly understand progress being made.

Feedback is also vital to organisational health. Conversations about the quality of education offered by the school are central elements of our professional connection. It is important to have the voice to speak into the organisation. It is also a relational imperative to be invited to do so.

Importantly, this feedback is not an event. It is not just fruit for the conversation, it is a part of the actual conversation. Some of the feedback we need is qualitative. This is the type of feedback that allows people to seek subtle nuances and to delve for the reasons things occur. Other feedback is quantitative. It measures opinions and experience against a scale. This is akin to the score in a football game. How the team played would be the qualitative discussion held in the post-match briefing with the coaching staff and players.

It is my firm opinion that both quantitative and qualitative are required to fully understand the whole story. The score never tells the whole story. The story is not compelling, engaging or specific without a score.

Our community is right in the middle of feedback season.


Our students are undertaking examinations. The result is some quantitative feedback (their grade) and some qualitative feedback in the form of conversations with teachers and parents. There will be affirmations and course corrections as a consequence.

Reports are being compiled as I write. They provide both grades and comments. The imperative of the follow-up conversation is the purpose of parent teacher night. Again, it is vital to gather information from both sources. Thus, parents receiving reports is compulsory. In my opinion, the face-to-face follow-up conversation is just as vital.

In the next few days, parents will receive a letter inviting them to contribute to the school survey of performance. This is a vital measure for us to manage our programme and measure our improvement. Through this, we establish the areas in which we need to grow, and those in which we can consolidate.

I want to invite all parents to complete this survey. Your opinion is important to us. Your feedback will guide us. The survey data will be directly comparable to that of last year.

We have worked in the interim to be responsive to the feedback. Some initiatives are already in progress, some have been planned, and others have been initiated as a consequence of the previous year's review. Some of the initiatives have a long lead-time because of their complexity.

I am pleased to announce that I have invited Mr Nick Heyne to undertake the task of researching the issues surrounding the implementation of a co-curricular programme. This programme is an important contribution to the development of Christian character and the development of students' talents. This will be a thorough and careful examination of the issues that need to be considered in regard to implementing a school-wide programme.

I am also delighted to announce that I have invited Kees Wierenga to undertake the task of researching our school founding in order that we create symbolic and cultural displays that honour and celebrate the school's history. You may have noticed new fencing is currently going up on the primary campus. This is part of the plan to continue to keep our students safe from unknown visitors. This will also direct all foot traffic to sign in at our office on arrival as is required.

Bikes, Skateboards and Scooters

Once the fencing is complete, no skateboards or scooters will be allowed to be used on school property as this is causing increasing damage to our facilities and we have had a number of near misses with students or members of the community colliding into other people.

In addition, students have been informed that they are to walk their bikes and scooters on the school grounds. Many students have been speeding past buildings and people and have caused themselves or other people injuries.

School Traffic

We have been informed that the Tassielink bus and Wisby bus will no longer pick Calvin students up from school if they cannot access the turning circle. We appreciate that the lack of available parking spaces can be frustrating, however between the hours of 8:20-9:00 and 2:45-3:30 the turning circle and staff carpark is not for parents to use. If parents continue to use them, students will be left stranded at school by the bus companies and parents will be required to collect their child from school. You can park your car on Maranoa Road, at the Woolworths car park or at the Reformed Church.

A reminder that children should not be at school before 8:20am. There are a number of children who are arriving at school well before 8:20am, in some cases before 8:00am. I respectfully request that children are not dropped off at this time as there is no supervision for them. Staff are in meetings or are preparing for the day ahead at this time of the day.






