Dear Parents and Community Members,

The school leadership team and staff have spent some time considering the importance of having clearly identified values around which to centre the Calvin Christian School experience. This is important for clarity and unity.

The draft of these values is included in the body of this newsletter. We have chosen the following values as central:

Love, Compassion, Courage, Generosity, and Diligence.

In the coming months we will be seeking community consultation regarding these values, and the document in general.

In the coming newsletters I wish to offer some comments on each of these values.

Love

Love is an essential core of life, family and community.

The essence of Christian love is that it manifests God's heart for His people and His creation. God is love (I John 4:8). God created people in His image, and so loving is a core relational notion of humanity.

Christian Love has some different qualities. Firstly, we acknowledge that love has a spiritual component. As Christians we accept that life is spiritual. Everything begins there. We accept that there is a spiritual power to love that is beyond the scope of human understanding. On occasions, the decision to express love is contrary to the natural impulse of self-interest. Thus we are called to love our enemies (Luke 6:27). We are called to have the spirit of God in us counsel our own soul towards wisdom;

For the flesh desires what is contrary to the Spirit, and the Spirit what is contrary to the flesh. They are in conflict with each other, so that you are not to do whatever you want. (Galatians 5:17)

Christian love has good manners. "It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs." (I Corinthians 13:5).

Christian love should look different. It always has. There was something powerful about Christs inclusion of outcasts and minority groups. There was power in the example and conduct of the early Christians as the Roman audience watched them be assaulted by lions in the Colosseum. There was something deeply revolutionary in the development of Chivalry amid the barbarism of the dark ages. Those values of protecting the weak and vulnerable, living with honour, being a force for compassion and justice. This was the origin of our modern civilised behaviour.

How does love become front page in our world? When recently, a father forgives the woman that killed his daughter. When on May 13, 1981, Pope John Paul II forgave Mehmet Ali Agca who tried to assassinate him. His Holiness met with Mehmet and prayed with him. When Corrie ten Boon forgave her guards in the concentration camp. These are great acts of love.

Scripture calls us to accept being falsely accused, to give sacrificially, to turn the other cheek, amongst other demonstrations of love.

What is the key to loving? To know that we are loved (Romans 8:31-39). To know that we are sons and daughters of the King. To lose the fear of man so that we can be of good courage for Christ.

As educational leaders and Christians we think that Love must be our central value.

extend resources and time to assist them (Luke 15:20; Matthew 25:35). We are

prepared to act.

COURAGE We are prepared to step first, stand alone, and go where others are not. (2 Timothy

2:16; 2 Corinthians 5:8; John 15:13) We **encourage** at every opportunity (Ephesians

4:29; I Thessalonians 5:11; Hebrews 3:13).

GENEROSITY We live with generosity wherever possible. We choose to bless with a little extra, go

a little further, or stay a little longer. (1 John 3:17; Romans 12:8).

DILIGENCE We value the steady and constant effort to accomplish what is undertaken. We are

industrious and not idle. (Proverbs 13:4; Proverbs 12:24) Persistence is a virtue

(Galatians 6:9; Philippians 3:14; Proverbs 12:27; James 1:12)

In all we do, we aim to build people who are equipped and willing to make a difference in the lives of others.




