Dear Parents and Community Members,

Last Saturday morning I was privy, along with 400 to 500 other people, to a wonderful act of humility and dignity. I shivered in the unseasonal wintry blast of Hobart spring weather to watch the Calvin Secondary Athletics Team compete in the Sports Association of Tasmanian Independent Schools (SATIS) athletic competition. Most of Tasmania's independent schools were competing.

I sat with the crowd and competitors and watched the women's 3000 metre event. Within the space of eight paces after completing, and winning, the event the crowd and I watched Ebony Webb stop and commence encouraging the other competitors as they embarked on their final lap. She applauded them as they passed her. As each competitor completed her race Ebony wrapped each person in a congratulatory hug. Notably, the hug was warmly returned. It was an impressive display of an orientation to the lives of others. Ebony demonstrated both her athletic prowess and her considerable character. She was a witness for all to see. Her running was impressive. Her character was inspiring.

It is precisely this approach that the notion of *Be your Best* is intending to highlight and foster. We encourage the 'doing' of students to achieve personal best outcomes. We unashamedly champion the 'being' of mature character.

Sportsmanship is infinitely more important than winning. To me that is obvious and essential. There is a destructive and corrosive force in the 'win at all costs' mentality. It is a dangerous seed that blossoms into narcissism and performance enhancing drugs.

Examples of the victory of character are everywhere at Calvin. One of them, last Saturday, was Ebony's behaviour. But last Saturday it was also members of our athletics team who were not openly victorious but who attended and competed. Some honoured their commitment to be in the team even when it was inconvenient and the weather was freezing. This week it was evident in our basketball players. It also existed, although hidden from public view, in the students committing to late nights to give their best effort to the challenging assignment deadline. This focus has a personal virtue. It has a public power as well


