Year Five have worked very hard making amazing THRASS themed board games. It was very challenging. Most students based their game on one that already exists but changed it to be THRASS-tastic!






























**Volunteers** needed to look after school stick insects and/or goldfish over the school holidays.

#### Re: Changes to Hobart City Bus Mall departure points

Metro Tasmania wishes to advise of changes to departure points in Hobart City for services travelling to the Eastern Shore, effective from Sunday 10 December. These changes are necessary to allow the construction of the Hyatt Centric hotel in the Elizabeth Street Bus Mall, and are expected to be in place until late-2019. Details are as shown below.

#### Effective Sunday 10 December, 2017

Bus Stops A, B, C & D in the Elizabeth Street Bus Mall will be closed.

Two new bus stops will be opened. Stop J will be located in Macquarie Street outside the former Mercury building (between Elizabeth and Argyle Streets), and Stop M will be located on Elizabeth Street at Franklin Square (between Davey and Macquarie Streets).

#### Routes departing Stop J

601, 606, 614, 615, 616, 624, 625, 634, 635, 646, 676, X15, X16, X34, X44, X45

#### Routes departing Stop M\*

654, 655, 664, X64, 685, 695

\*Eastern Shore services on all routes will depart from Stop J after 7pm on weeknights, and all day on Saturday, Sunday and public holidays.

More detailed information, including maps, is available on the Metro Tasmania website. Please note that departure times for Eastern Shore services remain unchanged.
