From the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

At the core of our school are three causes:

- Duty of care for the individual;
- Providing an environment to nurture faith; and,
- Delivering excellent learning outcomes.

These coexist as our major priorities.

Providing each of these involves dealing simultaneously with both the present and the future. Even on the first day of a new student's enrolment this positive tension between the forces of 'today and tomorrow' is evident. It exists in the simple fact that today's lesson will be assessed in subsequent weeks. It is evident in the caring concern of a staff member who agrees to check-in on wellbeing in a few days. It lives powerfully in the 'now' and 'not yet' that is at the heart of the Kingdom message that Jesus brings.

Our educational outcomes must provide the foundational skill, knowledge and attitudes to succeed in a future world. This world is rushing toward us.

Our current Kindergarten students will graduate in 2031. If they pursue university they might step into the world of work in 2035. What will that world look like? What are the skills and capabilities that they will need to have in their repertoire? What would our educational program need to contain in order to prepare them for this world?

There is a phrase in medical education which often gets aired at the welcoming lecture to medical school; "50% of what we teach you over the next 5 years will be wrong, or inaccurate. Sadly, we don't know which 50%." This is sometimes attributed to a past Dean of Medicine at Harvard.

From our vantage point in 2018, discerning the dominant themes and ideas of this future world is an engaging opportunity that we relish.

To that end, I am attending the EduTech conference in Sydney this week. In the constellation of conferences and exhibitions it is big; over 10,000 delegates, 200 speakers, and over 260 exhibitors. Lots of great ideas, innovations, fads and equipment.

It is valuable to gather ideas for our master planning process; furniture, lighting, design principles. Yesterday I attended an engaging series of sessions regarding building classrooms for the future. The information was wonderful for developing the means to navigate the design of appropriate learning spaces for our students now and in the future.

Today I am waist deep in robotics brochures.

Tomorrow, I am listening to a range of speakers offer insights to what schools of the future might provide and look like.

This week, I am firmly ensconced in tomorrow's world. Next week I will be back to building in the now and not yet.

This 'Golden Rule' comes from the bible quote:


Matthew 7:12 So in everything, do to others what you would have them do to you, for this sums up the Law and the Prophets.
