Dear Parents and Carers.

I think that it was Forrest Gump that said, "A Calvin Music night is like a box of chocolates, you always know what you are going to get!"

Last evening was another great evening of composition, performance and playing.

If you were not there, you missed a great evening of jazz, pop, blues, soul and a hint of boogie.

The Year 9 Ensemble opened the evening with a composition by Mr Brothers and played with flair and a spirit of the fun that can reverberate in music.

The Junior Band delivered great renditions of the 'Star Wars' theme and 'The Lost Kingdom'. These young players demonstrated that Calvin's performance reputation is secure for the future.

Under the direction of Madeleine Dyer the Vocal Ensemble delivered a moving performance of 'Take these Wings' and a spirited 'ABBA Medley'. Toes were tapping everywhere. I suspected one or two in the audience were tempted to sing along.

The audience was treated to some outstanding piano performances by David Vonk, Robyn Bosveld and Samarah Davey.

The groups and bands displayed a variety and versatility in performing 'Don't Bring me Down' (Electric Light Orchestra), the Gershwin classic, 'Summertime', and Crazy Little Thing Called Love' by Queen.

We were treated to two wonderful original compositions by Samuel Dickinson (Tag Two) and Hamish Powell (Fight for Freedom).

Without doubt the highlights amongst other highlights were the individual vocal performances. Aneke Heyne, was accompanied by Sam Dickinson in a haunting rendition of 'Lovely'. Thomas Di Pretoro revealed his prowess in songs from stage musicals with 'Mama a Rainbow' and a medley of 'It Had to be You/Don't Get Around Much Anymore'. Emma Rohrlach showcased her skill and vocal artistry by delivering a very Adele like version of 'Set Fire in the Rain' complete with vocal inflections and a deep emotion. Naomi Berg's version of 'Rainbow' was haunting and evocative and was testament to her development as a solo artist. Sam Muggeridge delivered a very polished rendition of Billy Joel's 'Honesty' and an emotionally charged and inspiring version of 'Bridge over Troubled Water' by Paul Simon. *continued next page*


The spirit of Calvin is driven by our walk in Christ and the expression of our values.








Old Testament Focus


