



From the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

I want to publicly express my appreciation to Stelle Carmichael for her effective leadership this week as (Acting) Deputy Principal – Head of Secondary. With Bonny Moroni and me both out of the school and Ian Riley absent due to illness, it was reassuring to all that Stelle's capacity with people and administration was available to bring stability and efficiency. Stelle has a gift for building community and everyone benefited from this opportunity for her to impact a wider sphere of influence.

I wanted to advise all members of our community that I have assumed the role of Deputy Principal – Head of Secondary for the remainder of this term. This takes immediate effect. Ian Riley is still struggling to heal from a back injury and requires significant rest to maximise his recuperation. I would ask that you would email or telephone me on any matters to deal with the Secondary School. Of course, if your child experiences any difficulties, the normal expectation is that parents would communicate with either the teacher of a specific subject, or the Heads of Year for overall welfare and progress. Should the occasion arise, parents should contact either our Head of Students, Stelle Carmichael, or our Director of Studies, Bonny Moroni. I always appreciate you calling the most appropriate person in the first instance, though I am also willing to take your call.

This week we have again welcomed Brian Parker to our school. Brian has worked with our Primary School to implement the Sharp Reading program and to further increase the instructional effectiveness of teachers. In this visit, Brian is working on these same initiatives with teachers in the Secondary School. He has been sharing his insights with all new teachers, and with the teachers of Year 7 and 8 English and SOSE for both this year and next year. We are committed to building the best possible pathways for all students to develop great skill levels in reading, mathematics and science. I am most appreciative of Brian Parker's contribution to this endeavour.

I wanted to update the school community on the progress of developing the Master Plan for our school. In recent weeks, a delegation, comprising our CEO David Gillman, Henk van Beelen and me, visited with Council operational staff. The outcome of these conversations is progressing well and I thank members of the Kingborough Council staff for their willingness to listen and actively lend us their support. We are presenting our conceptual plans to a sub-committee of Kingborough Council on September 17th. I would ask that you would be prayerful for this meeting. We have exciting plans for the future of the Calvin learning environment. We are particularly focused on finding sustainable solutions to the traffic challenges that affect the safety of our students.

YEAR 3 SCIENCE

Our class is enjoying a study this term of the Chemical Sciences. This has involved examining the properties of the three principal states of matter – solids, liquids and gases. We know that matter is anything that takes up space and has mass. Matter is made up of particles called atoms and molecules.

We have learnt that in solids, the particles are packed together so tightly they can hardly move. This is why solids have mass, a definite volume and a definite shape. In a liquid, the particles are close together, but are always moving around each other. This explains why liquids have mass, a definite volume but no definite shape. Liquids can obviously flow.

In a gas, the particles are far apart and bounce off each other so they can spread out to fill up any space. A gas, like a liquid, can flow and can get bigger or smaller to fit in different sized containers or vessels. Our balloon photographs (below) demonstrate this.

Sometimes, matter can share properties across states. Year 3 tested this by making Oobleck (cornflour goop). Oobleck behaves like both a liquid and a solid. It can flow and be poured like a liquid. When force is applied (such as punching it), Oobleck displays the properties of a solid. It is possible to fill a swimming pool with Oobleck and run across the surface of it without sinking. Beware if you should stop mid-sprint to consider why this is so!

We all agreed that Oobleck is one of the most fun ways to examine the properties of matter, being both a liquid and a solid.

NAPLAN ONLINE

TRIAL OF THE NEW ONLINE ASSESSMENT PLATFORM

PRIMARY &

You may have heard that NAPLAN Online is being introduced across Australia over three years from 2018. Tasmanian schools will be administering NAPLAN online from 2019.

NAPLAN Online will provide better assessment, more precise results and faster turnaround of information.

Our school will trial the new assessment platform (the computer system the test will be taken on) and assess our readiness to participate in NAPLAN Online from 2019. This trial is called the School Readiness Test (SRT).

The SRT is not a test of student achievement and results will not form part of a student's overall assessment.

Participating in this trial is important as it will help us ensure we have adequate internet connectivity, and whether students have access to sufficient number of devices for NAPLAN testing. During the trial, our school will have the opportunity to practice managing the classroom logistics for an online assessment and the new test administration processes.

Feedback from schools participating in the trial will inform transition to the online assessment as well as provide valuable feedback to shape the final development of the NAPLAN Online platform.

The SRT has not been constructed to assess curriculum knowledge, but rather to provide students an opportunity to experience the types of questions that will be included in the new online assessment.

During September 2018, selected students in Years 2, 4, 6 & 8 will participate in the trial of the assessment platform, by undertaking two online tests that include examples of the new NAPLAN Online questions. Each test will take approximately 45 minutes to complete.

Participation in this trial is a key step to ensuring a successful NAPLAN Online experience.

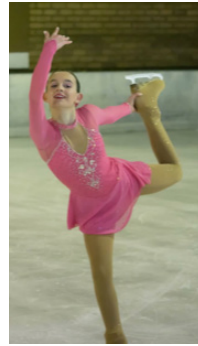
