## YEAR 2

This term Year 2 have been investigating how to use our Earth's resources wisely, focussing on mainly the 3R's, **Reduce, Reuse, Recycle**. This included surveys at home, looking at what can and can't be recycled. The second survey was about water usage and how we can minimise this.

Some observations and hints the students found could reduce water usage in the home include:

### LAUNDRY

clothes washer, soaking clothes, mopping floors.

**HINTS:** only run full washing loads, use water saver mode, only partly fill the trough to soak

### OUTDOORS

watering the garden, washing the car, filling the pool, water fights.

**HINTS:** used a bucket to wash the car and don't water the garden through the day

### BATHROOM

toilet, cleaning teeth, shower, bath.

**HINTS:** use the half flush, or only flush for 'number 2', turn the tap off whilst cleaning your teeth, time and have a shorter shower, have a shallow bath, use hand sanitiser instead of washing your hands

### KITCHEN

dishwasher, washing dishes, cooking, hot drinks.

**HINTS:** wait until the dishwasher is full or run half cycles and use water saver mode, only fill the sink and saucepans at far as they need to be.

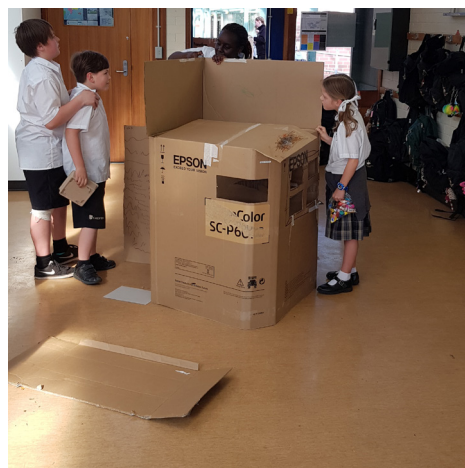
Over the last two weeks Year 2 have paired up with their Year 6 buddies in a STEM challenge, focussing on re-using and recycling.

The challenge was to make a shelter:

- No bigger than one square metre
- The Year two student must be able to sit upright, and lay down in a huddled position within this shelter
- NO materials are to be purchased, they must re-use materials found at home
- The only materials provided for the students are, one ball of string and a roll of masking tape!

It has been great watching the buddies work together; discussing, designing, creating and reassessing their product. I look forward to seeing the final products. Here are some photos of the progress made so far!

# NAPLAN ONLINE

TRIAL OF THE NEW ONLINE ASSESSMENT PLATFORM

PRIMARY &

You may have heard that NAPLAN Online is being introduced across Australia over three years from 2018. Tasmanian schools will be administering NAPLAN online from 2019.

NAPLAN Online will provide better assessment, more precise results and faster turnaround of information.

Our school will trial the new assessment platform (the computer system the test will be taken on) and assess our readiness to participate in NAPLAN Online from 2019. This trial is called the School Readiness Test (SRT).

The SRT is not a test of student achievement and results will not form part of a student's overall assessment.

Participating in this trial is important as it will help us ensure we have adequate internet connectivity, and whether students have access to sufficient number of devices for NAPLAN testing. During the trial, our school will have the opportunity to practice managing the classroom logistics for an online assessment and the new test administration processes.

Feedback from schools participating in the trial will inform transition to the online assessment as well as provide valuable feedback to shape the final development of the NAPLAN Online platform.

The SRT has not been constructed to assess curriculum knowledge, but rather to provide students an opportunity to experience the types of questions that will be included in the new online assessment.

During September 2018, selected students in Years 2, 4, 6 & 8 will participate in the trial of the assessment platform, by undertaking two online tests that include examples of the new NAPLAN Online questions. Each test will take approximately 45 minutes to complete.

Participation in this trial is a key step to ensuring a successful NAPLAN Online experience.

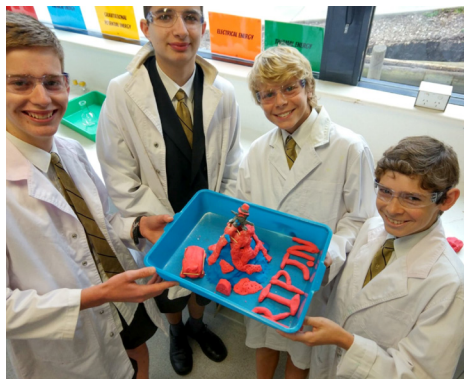
## YEAR 9 SCIENCE
